Dangerous Plants Policy

LEAPS Suffolk recognises that many plants are poisonous if eaten or capable of causing allergic reactions if handled. Accordingly, no plants on the list of the dangerous plants shown below are allowed on the premises without first conducting a risk assessment to review the degree of risk posed to the attendees.

The outside play areas at the Club have also been checked for the dangerous plants listed below. Where a potentially dangerous plant exists and we are unable to remove it, we have conducted a risk assessment which takes into account: the ages and maturity of the attendees, the degree of supervision required, whether we need to restrict access to affected areas, how attendees with allergies might be affected. The following is a list of the most commonly found plants that staff should be aware of as posing a possible hazard.

If a dangerous plant is found in the grounds, the Manager will contact the Site Manager of the school as soon as possible
